Scan a QR code with your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch

Learn how to use the built-in camera on your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch to scan a Quick Response (QR) code for links to websites, apps, tickets, and more.

QR codes give you quick access to websites without having to type or remember a web address. You can use the Camera app to scan a QR code.

How to scan a QR code with the Camera app

- 1. Open the Camera app from the Home Screen, Control Center, or Lock Screen.
- Select the rear facing camera. Hold your device so that the QR code appears in the viewfinder in the Camera app. Your device recognizes the QR code and shows a notification.
- 3. Tap the notification to open the link associated with the QR code.

Android Phones



- Newer Android Phones may have QR scanners build into their cameras – to find out:
 - 1. Open your camera and with rear facing camera point it at the QR code until the view finder surrounds the QR code.
 - 2. Tap the notification on the phone to open the weblink
- Older Android phones may require you to download a QR scanner from your App store.



DISTRACTED DRIVING CRASHES

• FROM 2017 TO 2021, THERE WERE 64, 108 DISTRACTED DRIVING CRASHES.

- MALE DRIVERS MADE UP 55% OF THESE CRASHES.
- 1 IN 3 OF THESE CRASHES INVOLVED DRIVERS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 15 AND 24.



FATAL CRASHES

• FROM 2017 THROUGH 2021 DISTRACTED DRIVING LED TO 206 FATAL CRASHES THAT RESULTED IN 226 DEATHS.


• MALES MADE UP 64% OF THESE FATAL CRASHES.

949 DD RELATED CRASHES



WHAT DO THE NUMBERS MEAN?

- DISTRACTED DRIVING IS DIFFICULT TO TRACK.
- DISTRACTED DRIVING IS LIKELY UNDERREPORTED ON CRASH REPORTS.
- UNLESS IT IS OBSERVED OR THERE IS EVIDENCE, DISTRACTED DRIVING HARD TO PROVE.



DISTRACTED DRIVING MEANS:

- ANY AND ALL ACTIVITIES KEEPING YOUR MIND OFF THE ROADWAY:
 - TEXTING OR TALKING ON THE PHONE
 - TALKING TO PASSENGERS
 - EATING
 - READING
 - APPLYING MAKEUP
 - BEING EMOTIONALLY DISTRAUGHT
 - BLASTING LOUD MUSIC



WHAT IS DISTRACTED DRIVING?

• DISTRACTED DRIVING IS ANY NON-DRIVING ACTIVITY A PERSON ENGAGES IN THAT HAS The potential to distract them from the <u>primary task</u> of driving and increases the risk of crashing.



DISTRACTIONS CAN BE:

- VISUAL TAKING YOUR EYES OFF THE ROADWAY.
- MANUAL TAKING YOUR HANDS OFF THE WHEEL.
- COGNITIVE TAKING YOUR MIND OFF OF DRIVING.



TEXTING INCLUDES ALL THREE OF THESE!



ADDITIONAL CONSEQUENCES

- IN OCTOBER 2018, OHIO PASSED HOUSE BILL 95 (DISTRACTED DRIVING PENALTIES INCREASED).
- IF THE DISTRACTION WAS A CONTRIBUTING FACTOR TO THE COMMISSION OF THE VIOLATION, THERE WILL BE AN ADDITIONAL \$100 FINE.
